The Outstanding Civil Engineering Achievement (OCEA) Awards recognize projects for their contributions to the well-being of people and communities, their resourcefulness in planning and design challenges, and their innovations in materials and techniques. The 2008 finalists include: the Arsenic Crisis in the Indian Subcontinent: Sustainable Engineering Solution (West Bengal, India); the Mission Valley East Light-Rail Transit Project (San Diego); the Pasadena City Hall Seismic Upgrade and Rehabilitation Project (California); the Tacoma Narrows Bridge (Washington); and the Woodrow Wilson Bridge Project (Washington, D.C.). This year's award winning project will be announced at the OPAL Gala, April 30 in Arlington, Va.

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
